Admissions will communicate with new freshmen and new transfers.

Withdrawing students should contact the Residence Life Office to withdraw officially.

WEB REGISTRATION (returning students only)

- Make an appointment to meet with your adviser. This is mandatory!
- All students have a registration hold which can only be released by the assigned adviser. (If you have changed advisers and have not submitted the paper work to the registrar's office, please do so NOW!)

Note: You may need to register for some classes on paper in the registrar's office (e.g. due to time conflicts, closed classes, special courses, etc.) Your adviser's signature will be required for paper registration.

PAPER REGISTRATION

- Make an appointment to meet with your adviser. This is mandatory!
- Complete the <u>front and back</u> of the paper registration form and take it to your adviser for approval. Include the course abbreviation, number, and section (Example: ENG 101 01). The form is available in the Registrar's Office.
- Your adviser must sign the completed schedule AND release the registration hold.
- Take your signed registration form to the Registrar's Office according to the chart above.

ADDS & DROPS

We highly recommended that you **CONSULT YOUR ADVISER** regarding any schedule changes. **ADDS:** Credits beyond 20 will result in extra tuition charges.

NEVER drop below 12 credits per semester without consulting your adviser. In addition to academic repercussions, this could affect or negate financial aid, athletic eligibility, and health insurance. **DROPS**:

The last day to add a class, change a section, or use web registration is JANUARY 12.

Attention Federal Financial Aid recipients: Be advised that courses not needed for your program(s) of study are not eligible for federal financial aid. Please consult with your advisor if your Advising Worksheet on my.geneva.edu indicates that you are enrolled in classes listed under Additional Coursework.

- For all students who enroll before Summer 2016, TWO physical education classes are required for the core. One must be an activity class (PED 101) and one a physical fitness class (PED 103). These receive a letter grade.
 - PED 104 is an elective for varsity sports only, is graded CR or NC, and is subject to the 8-credit limit for 1-credit courses.
- Courses numbered <u>095</u> do not count toward graduation or overall GPA but do count for financial aid and full-time enrollment. These courses may NOT be taken as an audit.
- The following courses require special forms and signatures and may NOT be added or dropped on the Web: Independent Studies; Internships; Practica; Music Lessons; Honors Courses.
- Credit/No Credit is an option for juniors and seniors with a minimum 2.5 GPA and cannot be used for core or major requirements, and only one such course is permitted per semester. Forms are available in the registrar's office.
- Evening classes are course numbers ending in E1 or E2.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Tuition/Fees. Part time (under 12 cr.) \$880 per credit hour; full time (12-20 cr.) \$13,035 per semester. These charges will be reduced according to the College Refund Policy upon formal withdrawal with the Student Development Office. Additional fees are charged for some courses included in lab or art courses, select education courses, and music lessons and education classes.

Please see the Financial Information section of the college catalog.

Payment Policy. A financial obligation to the college for the full amount of the semester's charges is incurred by the student upon registration. Students must have a zero balance on their account from previous semesters before registering.

- Charges not covered by financial aid are due January 2 for Spring semester.
- Bills may be paid by check or cash or paid monthly to the Student Financial Services Office, or paid monthly through Nelnet Business Solutions, which is an outside optional service provided for a fee.
- Students are financially responsible for all charges incurred until such time as he/she officially withdraws.
- Online payment options will be available with Nelnet Business Solutions.
