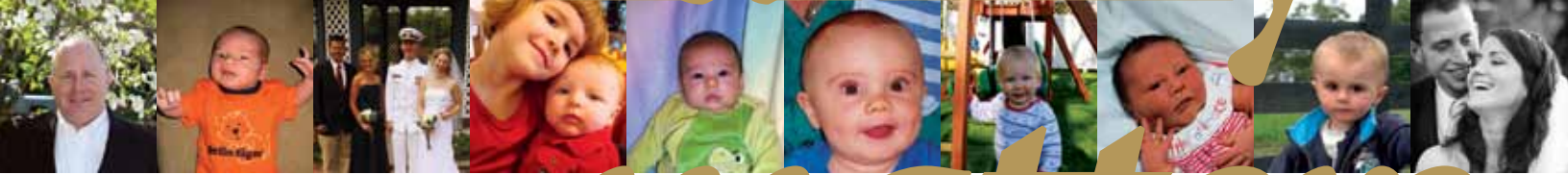

"This is a gift for all alumni to use to hopefully find their friends, make professional career networking links and rekindle the memories of their time at Geneva," says Ben Becze '00, director of alumni relations.

The GAP has a variety of features that allow alumni to connect and communicate. "The main feature is the alumni

directory," says Joanie Baumgartner, an independent alumni relations consultant who helped the college develop the GAP. "Alumni can send messages to fellow grads and chat in real time. They can also update their own information at any time, helping the college and fellow alumni to stay connected with them in a streamlined way."

Other features include a class notes section where alumni can view and post updates on jobs, births, marriages and more. An events section allows alumni to find out what's happening at the college or in their area, register for events or join a planning committee.

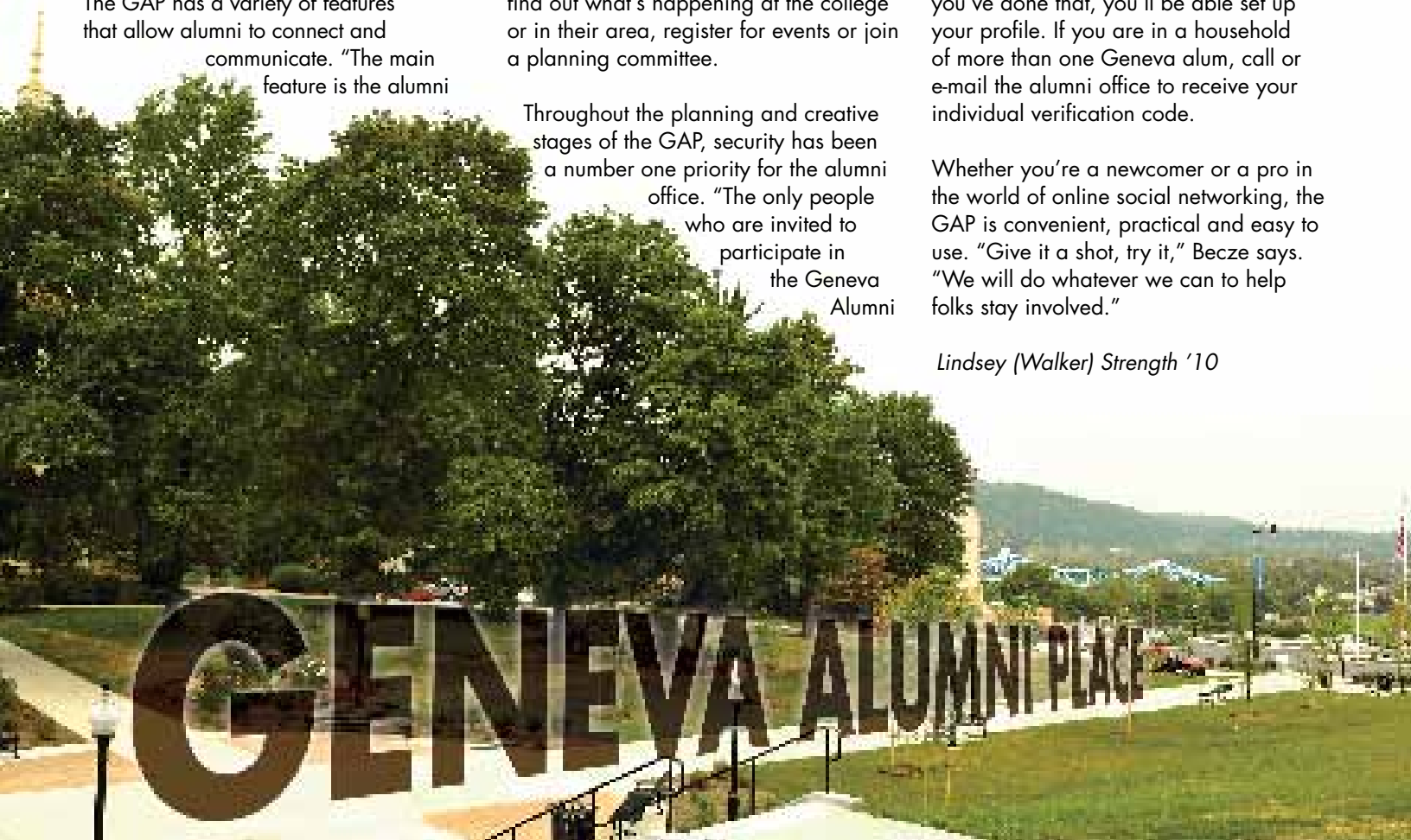
Throughout the planning and creative stages of the GAP, security has been a number one priority for the alumni office. "The only people who are invited to participate in the Geneva Alumni

Place are graduates of this school," Becze says. "Everyone is given an individual log-in name and password and will have the capabilities to set privacy levels as to how much will be shared with other members of the GAP."

To get started, simply look on the back mailing label of this issue of *Family Matters*. You will see next to your name a unique GAP verification code. Go to www.gap.geneva.edu and click on FIRST TIME LOGIN. Search to find your name and enter your verification code. Once you've done that, you'll be able set up your profile. If you are in a household of more than one Geneva alum, call or e-mail the alumni office to receive your individual verification code.

Whether you're a newcomer or a pro in the world of online social networking, the GAP is convenient, practical and easy to use. "Give it a shot, try it," Becze says. "We will do whatever we can to help folks stay involved."

Marian (Gilmore '34) Harris



Marian (Gilmore '34) Harris was born in Washington, Pennsylvania and grew up in Cadiz, Ohio. After graduating from Geneva College with a Latin

degree, she taught high school students and spent the summers working towards her master's in speech pathology. During World War II, she served as a recreational director for the Red Cross in Army Hospital and later developed a speech program for disabled children for the State of Delaware. She then went on to teach at Case Western Reserve University and at the Cleveland Hearing and Speech Center.

In 1961, Dr. Harris returned to Geneva College where she taught as an associate professor of speech and founded the speech pathology program, now the communication disorders major.

"She fiercely defended that program when a round of cuts was being made," says Professor Emerita Dr. Ann Paton. "Without Marian that program would have been long gone. I can also assure you that 'her' majors always did well in graduate school. She was greatly respected on campus and in her profession."

Dr. Harris later served as Geneva's dean of women and retired from teaching in 1978. For her exemplary service to the college and community, she received the Lifetime G award, Geneva's highest alumni honor.

"Marian was a person of strong faith and conviction, upright in posture and behavior," Dr. Paton says. "As dean she had zero tolerance for improper or immoral behavior, yet she had a compassionate heart, and would fearlessly go to bat for any student that she thought was being unfairly or unjustly treated. I think 'rectitude' is the word that most succinctly summarizes Marian ... She was a demanding, excellent, beloved teacher."

Dr. Harris died December 8, 2008 at the age of 95 in Manassas, Virginia. She is survived by her husband, Colonel Frank W. Harris, her sister Elizabeth Dennison, brother Charles, stepsons Frank and Christian, stepdaughter Abigail, and six grandchildren.
