## Our Charge

## Our Record

The Geneva Women's Tennis team has carved out a niche for itself in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC). Since joining in the fall of 2007 as a provisional member, the team has had a winning record against PAC opponents each of the past five seasons. With a steady roster size

of 14, the depth of talent promises more of the same in the coming years. The 2011 campaign marked the first year for Geneva as an official member of the PAC. The team finished the fall season with a 5-4 record within the PAC, and within its first trip to the PAC Championship, finished fourth out of 10. Sophomore Julie Kline led the team in match wins in the 2011 season, and culminated her season in style, earning runner-up at the #4 Singles position and Second Team All-Conference honors. Kline, along with Kara Zimmerman, Sarah Cypher and Brittany Kress, also received PAC Academic Honors.

## Our Student-Athletes

Our roster this year represents six different states and seven different majors. While our team is a mix of different backgrounds and personalities, we come together with two common passions: tennis and God. This gives us unity no matter what other differences we may have.

## Our Coach

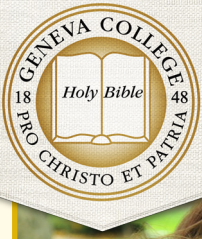
