The Geneva Men's Soccer program strives to be a perennial powerhouse in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III and in the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA), while cultivating Christian leadership and excellence through our four core values of passion, character, discipline and brotherhood. Exemplifying Christian principles on the field, in the classroom and in everyday life is central to the mission of the program. We recognize the talents and abilities that God has given to each member of the team and dedicate ourselves to using them for God's glory.

Our Record

Since Geneva joined the PAC in 2007, the Men's Soccer program has earned a record of 69-27-5. In the past two seasons, the Golden Tornadoes have accumulated 30 wins, nine losses and five ties. The 2011 season was one of great success. After finishing second in the conference, Geneva won the NCCAA East Region and

moved into the NCCAA National Championship Tournament, where they finished second in the nation. The NCCAA national championship runner-up honor was made even more special by the fact that Geneva College was the only non-scholarship program competing in the eight-team field. Geneva finished the 2011 season ranked seventh in the NCAA Great Lakes Region.

Our Student-Athletes

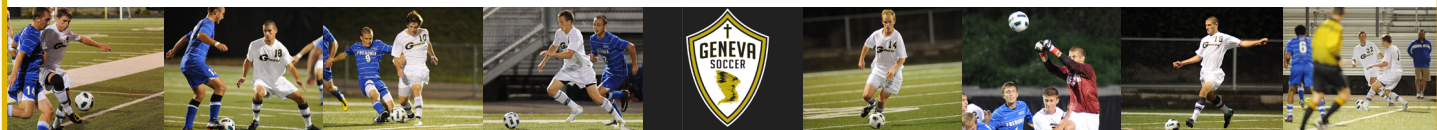
Our student-athletes are committed to excellence on the field, in the classroom and in their spiritual walk with Christ. In the 2011 season, our student-athletes were honored with many awards, including one National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-American, two NCCAA All-Americans, two All-Region players, six All-Conference players, seven Scholar All-Americans and an NCCAA Team Academic Award. While our efforts on the field give our program great pride and recognition, it is the work in the classroom that will remain our top priority.

Our Coaches

In his two years with the program, Coach Gary Dunda has earned a record of 30-9-5. Dunda, a four-year starter while at Messiah College, began his coaching career as an assistant for his alma mater one year after graduation. Coach Dunda spent the 10 years prior to joining the program at Geneva College as the head men's soccer coach at Goucher College. Preceding his time at Goucher, Coach Dunda had coaching stints as the women's soccer coach at Missouri Valley and the associate men's and women's coach at Ottawa University. Coach Dunda is joined by his former teammate and current assistant coach Tim Edris. Together, Coach Dunda and Coach Edris led the program to their first national tournament appearance in 10 years. This coaching staff demands and expects excellence in every sense of the word.
