TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCOMMODATIONS: First class hotels based on twin occupancy with bath. Hotel category determined through documentation published by O.H.R.G. Single-room supplement \$450.

MEALS: American breakfast, and dinner daily throughout the tour. Extra charge for coffee, tea or other beverage not included in the menu of the day.

TIPS AND TAXES: Those normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as "service" are included, as are all governmental and local taxes on hotels and meals. US and foreign departure taxes (\$110), tips to guides, drivers and portage are included (approximately \$10 per person per hotel night).

SIGHTSEEING: By modern motorcoach including services of English-speaking guides and entrance fees to places included in the itinerary.

NOT INCLUDED: Passport fees, laundry, wines, liquors, mineral waters and after-dinner coffee or tea, meals not included in the itinerary, sightseeing or services other than those specifically mentioned.

TOUR PRICE: Based on tariffs and rates in effect on January 12, 2007, and subject to change without notice should there be a revision in rates prior to departure of tour.

DEPOSIT AND CANCELLATION: A deposit of \$300 per person is required to secure reservations, which sum will be applied to the price of the tour, balance to be paid in full not later than 6 weeks prior to departure of the tour. Reservations made within 90 days of departure are subject to \$25 late reservation charge. In event of cancellation, refund in full will be made up to 90 days prior to departure, **excluding a \$100 administrative fee**. For cancellations received 89 to 35 days prior to departure, refund in full will be made **excluding a \$100 airline cancellation fee plus a \$50 administrative fee**. If cancellation is not received at this time, refund will be subject to a **minimum 25 percent cancellation fee or an amount equal to expenses to the tour operator, whichever is greater**. All cancellation must be in writing to Maranatha Tours and will be in effect on date of receipt by Maranatha Tours. Any exceptions must be in writing from Maranatha Tours, Inc.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round-trip economy class jet via Swissair Airlines or any other IATA member. Based on 6-day minimum/21-day maximum advanced purchase fare. Full payment due 45 days prior to commencement of travel. If passenger effects cancellation within 35 days of departure or after air tickets are written, whichever comes sooner, 100 percent of airfare will be forfeited by passenger. In the event 15 passengers do not book the tour within 90 days of departure, the agent reserves the right to cancel the tour. All airfares subject to government approval and change without notice.

RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY: Land arrangements including surface transportation: Maranatha Tours, Inc., and the participating Tour Operators operate the land tours offered under this program only as agents of the railroads, car rental contractors, steamship lines, hotels, bus operators, sightseeing contractors and others which provide the actual land arrangements and are not liable for any act, omission, delay, injury, loss or damage or non-performance occurring in connection with these land arrangement. Swissair Airlines and other IATA carriers, steamship lines and other transportation companies whose services are featured in these tours are not to be held responsible for any act, omission or event during the time passengers are not on board their conveyance. The passage contract in use by these companies when issued shall constitute the sole contract between the companies and the purchaser of these tours and/or passage.

CHANGE FEE: All changes not received in writing by Maranatha Tours at least 45 days prior to departure will incur a \$50 change fee per person for each revision.

LAND ARRANGEMENTS: The tour operator reserves the right to change the itinerary due to emergencies.

June 11, 2007 – Geneva College

June 11 (Mon) PITTSBURGH / PHILADELPHIA / GLASGOW

Today we will meet at Pittsburgh Airport for our flight to Philadelphia. Upon arrival we will transfer to our flight on U S Airways to Glasgow.

June 12 (Tues) GLASGOW

This morning we will arrive and be met by our escort and transfer to the hotel.

This afternoon we will have a panoramic tour of Glasgow, visiting St. Mungo's Cathedral and viewing Clydeside, the City Hall and George Square. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 13 (Wed) GLASGOW / STIRLING CASTLE / LOCH LOMOND / OBAN

This morning we will go to historic Stirling Castle castle. A number of Scottish Kings and Queens have been baptised, or crowned, or have died within or near Stirling Castle. Continue to the Clan Memorial before a drive along the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond and travel through the Trossachs.

This afternoon we head to Oban and check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 14 (Thurs.) OBAN / IONA / OBAN

Today we will visit Iona, the cradle of Christianity in Scotland. St. Columba founded a monastery here in 562, and from it missionaries spread throughout the British Isles and beyond.

Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 15 (Fri.) OBAN / ST. ANDREWS / EDINBURGH

This morning we will go to St Andrews to visit the Martyrs Monument and the sites of the executions of Patrick Hamilton and George Wishart, early Protestant martyrs. We will visit St. Andrews Cathedral.

This afternoon we will board our motor coach and head to Edinburgh. Upon arrival we will check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 16 (Sat.) EDINBURGH

This morning as part of our tour of Edinburgh, we will go to St. Giles Cathedral, the Grass Market and Greyfriars Kirkyard, all sites important in Covenanter history. We will continue to Edinburgh Castle.

This afternoon we will have some leisure time to shop or continue touring this great city. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 17 (Sun.) EDINBURGH / FERRY / BELFAST

As we travel from Edinburgh to the Ireland ferry, we will stop near Wigtown at the monument to the two Margarets, noted Covenanter martyrs. Continue to Stranraer and board our ferry.

This afternoon we will arrive in Belfast. We will have a panoramic tour of this city. Visit Belfast City Hall before we head to our hotel where we check in and have dinner.

We will make every attempt to provide opportunity for Sabbath observance.

June 18 (Mon) BELFAST / ST PATRICKS

This morning our excursion takes us to Downpatrick. We will explore the legacy of St. Patrick. Continue to St. Patrick's Center and visit two of St. Patrick's churches.

This afternoon we will travel north to the scenic Giant's Causeway and then on to the walled city of Londonderry where we will visit the Tower Museum and view "The Story of Derry" which tells the colourful and dramatic history of the city from earliest prehistory to the present.

Return to our bus for our drive back to Belfast. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 19 (Tues) BELFAST / DUBLIN

This morning we will go to Boyne Valley and visit the Bru na Boinne Visitor Centre. It was used for Iron Age burials. The Normans settled the area in the Middle Ages and in 1690 it was the site of the famous Battle of the Boyne. Continue to the Hill of Tara.

Continue to Dublin, a city over 1000 years of history, which has experienced many changes, particularly in the last decade. European Union membership and increased prosperity have transformed Dublin into a multicultural city with a thriving economy, ranking it among the top tourist destinations in Europe. An hour walk from the top of Grafton Street, across the Liffey, up O'Connell Street, and farther into north Dublin is a walk through time.

Our highlights will be Trinity College and St. Patrick's Cathedral. Check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 20 (Wed) DUBLIN

Today we will transfer to Cashel. We will visit the Rock of Cashel. Continue to Limerick whose origins date back to when the Vikings sailed up the Shannon Estuary in 922 and founded a settlement on an island. With the arrival of the Normans in

1194, St. Mary's Cathedral and the great castle of King John were built.

This afternoon we will visit Bunratty Castle. Bunratty Castle is a castle of Norman architecture in Newmarket-on-Fergus, County Clare, Ireland. It lies in the centre of Bunratty village. Continue to Folkpark and then to the Hunt Museum. This museum houses the personal and private collection of John and Gertrude Hunt collected over their lifetime. Three floors of galleries exhibit 2000 original pieces of art and antiquity from the Neolithic period to the 20th Century. Travel to our hotel in Shannon for dinner and overnight.

June 21 (Thur) SHANNON / PHILADELPHIA / PITTSBURGH

This morning we will be taken to the airport for our flight back home. We have had a great trip learning our Covenanter roots.
