Geneva seeks to prepare well-qualified Christian teachers for careers in both public and Christian schools. Teachers have great impact on the social, personal and intellectual development of individuals. Distinctive to Geneva, our students develop a perspective on “teaching redemptively” in the classrooms.

- Experiential classroom learning available as early as freshman year

- Geneva’s test for teacher certification in elementary education (Praxis II) first-time pass rate is 99%—one of the highest in the state
