SPRING BRIDGE SCHEDULE 2013

SESSION 1 Beaver Falls Campus

PLS 401 – Christian Faith & Politics (3 elective credits; 5 sessions)

Mondays 1/14/13 – 02/18/13 (no class on Martin Luther King Day, Jan.21)

This course introduces students to Scriptural and philosophic underpinnings of government; as the student explores Biblical principles of justice, economics, and liberty.

ACE 232 – Christian Redemption in the Books of Ruth and Jonah (3 elective credits; 6 sessions)

Tuesdays 01/08/13- 02/19/13 (no class on February 12)

This course is an in-depth study of these two short OT books, exploring not simply their historical and textual aspects, but particularly focusing on their role in God's overall redemptive plan.

PSS 313 Abnormal Psychology (3 elective credits; 8 sessions)

Thursday 01/10/13-02/28/13

This course examines the empirically based principles of psychopathology. Topics survey classical mental illness from a variety of perspectives.

<u>BBL 112 – Old Testament Survey (3 Old Testament core or elective credits; 8 sessions)</u>

Mondays 01/07/13 - 02/25/13

This course introduces adult students to the history, doctrine and background features of the books of the Bible that were written prior to the incarnation of Jesus Christ. Our primary goal in this course is to help students become better readers of the Old Testament. Every reader of the Bible is an interpreter of the Bible. This course requires no background Bible knowledge.

SESSION 2 Beaver Falls Campus

<u>HUM 119 – Renaissance to the Present (3 humanities core or elective credits; 8 sessions)</u>

Thursdays 03/07/13 - 05/02/13 (no class on March 28.)

This is a survey course of the historical, cultural, social, economic, and religious developments in western civilization. This course will examine, through reading, writing, and discussion, the dominant ideas in western culture as expressed in the philosophy, art, literature, and music from a Christian perspective.

BIB 113 – Introduction to the New Testament (3 New Testament core or elective credits; 8 sessions)

Wednesdays 03/06/13 - 04/24/13

This course introduces adult students to the history, doctrine and background features of those books of the Bible that were written in connection with the incarnation of Jesus Christ. Our primary goal in this course is to help students become better readers of the New Testament.

ACE 112 – World of Islam (3 elective credits; 6 sessions)

Thursdays 3/07/13 - 5/02/13 (no class on March 28)

This course studies the historical roots of Islamic religion in the sixth and seventh centuries, including persons, forces, and cities instrumental in its development. It considers the key tenets and emphases of the Koran and the different branches that have existed since that time (Shiite and Sunni). The course addresses the phenomenon of modern Fundamentalist movements in Islam and the features (ethnic, religious, and economic) that mark its relationship with Western cultures.
