Geneva conferred approximately 400 undergraduate degrees this spring, marking a conclusion to studies and a new start for the Class of 2007. But for two of the cap-and-gown-attired women in particular, walking up to receive a diploma May 12 held an especially deep significance.

That's because right before college officials called business major Thandi Dlodlo to the stage, she first watched as her mother, Flora Dlodlo, officially "walked" 24 years after originally receiving her degree. Flora, who finished her Geneva studies along with her husband and fellow Zimbabwe native Mqhele Dlodlo in 1983, was unable to attend commencement that year because she had given birth to Thandi just two days prior—on May 12, 1983.

The Dlodlos traveled from their current home in Cape Town, South Africa, to see Thandi graduate this May. When commencement officials announced to Flora's complete surprise that she would have a second opportunity to walk, Flora was overwhelmed.

"It was a memorable occasion which my family will treasure forever," she says. "There is just no place like Geneva—we are fortunate that our daughter also chose to attend this great college. The Geneva experience has been a blessing to us all."

Thandi recently moved to Philadelphia, where she will be working and planning her wedding, set for December 2008 in South Africa. ■

A LEADER AT *Heart*



On March 10—just one day after the Beaver County Chamber of Commerce honored him as BCCC's first emeritus board member—Paul Jewell threw the opening pitch at a Pittsburgh Pirates game in Bradenton, Fla.

Paul Jewell '67 and his wife, Joy (Morgan '68) Jewell, were busy following the Pirates' spring training in Florida this March but made a quick trip home after being urged to attend the annual Beaver County Chamber of Commerce (BCCC) Gala.

Paul was surprised to discover at the March 9 event that he was the first recipient of a lifetime board emeritus position, created by the chamber's board of directors to honor the efforts and contributions of serving members. Since 1975, Paul has been active as a board president, chairman and, since 1990, treasurer.

He is an obvious choice for the position, according to BCCC Chairman Kevin Cooke, because of his determination to "make Beaver County a better place to live, work and play in his professional and personal career." Cooke lauds the many professional and volunteer successes that have made Paul "a

leader and a role model in our community for years." Along with the chamber, Paul has been involved in the Beaver County Foundation, the American Heart Association, Geneva's Beyond the Bend project, Habitat for Humanity and the Center for Organ Recovery and Education. As the recipient of a heart transplant in 1993, he is active on the advisory group of University of Pittsburgh Medical Center that plans artificial heart celebration events and also works with Team Pittsburgh, a group that organizes national athletic events for transplant recipients.

Paul has played a variety of roles at Geneva, where Joy currently serves as dean of student development. He has coached Geneva's baseball team, worked as executive director of alumni affairs and taught speech. ■



J U S T B E Y O N D T H E B E N D

Geneva's \$7.5 million Beyond the Bend campus renovation project is gaining momentum as Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) crews work to relocate hazardous State Route 18—a busy artery that has long cut through campus.

After more than half a century of concerns, efforts and hopes, a rejuvenated campus is within view with the moving of the road. The college plans to redevelop the old roadbed into a pedestrian mall and add an arched main entrance and new landscaping.

The \$7.5 million project also includes a completely revamped Reeves Field. Crews installed artificial turf at Reeves during the winter months, and improvements to Reeves' aging bleachers, press box and other stadium facilities are slated for 2008. The new Route 18 is scheduled for completion this November.
