Checklist for selecting a Off-Campus Program

I have:

- Visited the Crossroads Office and searched the Crossroads webpage online.
- Clearly articulated my personal goals for wanting to study abroad.
- Researched the host country that I am interested in.
- Determined what study abroad program group size and class size would be ideal for me
- Considered whether I prefer to be in a class with citizens of the host country, other American students or a combination of the two.
- Spoken with students that have participated in the program and/or read written evaluations from past participants.(See binders in Crossroads office)
- Researched what kind of facilities my program has. (i.e. a one person)office versus a comprehensive campus. Residence halls vs. host family, Dining halls, etc.)
- Researched and understand what support services and activities are available through the program in the U.S. and abroad
- Researched the cost of the program and what the cost covers
 - a) The program cost is the SAME or MORE than Geneva College tuition/room & board.
 - b) I know how much money I will need in order to participate in the program I have chosen.
 - c) I know about how much money I think I will spend while studying abroad.
 - d) I know whether the cost of living where I will be studying is higher, lower or the same as that in the U.S.
 - e) I know the limits of what my financial aid package covers for my chosen program.
 - f) In case I don't receive the scholarships, fellowships, grants or loans I applied for, I have a back-up plan.
