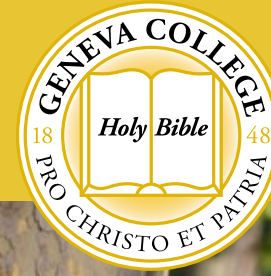

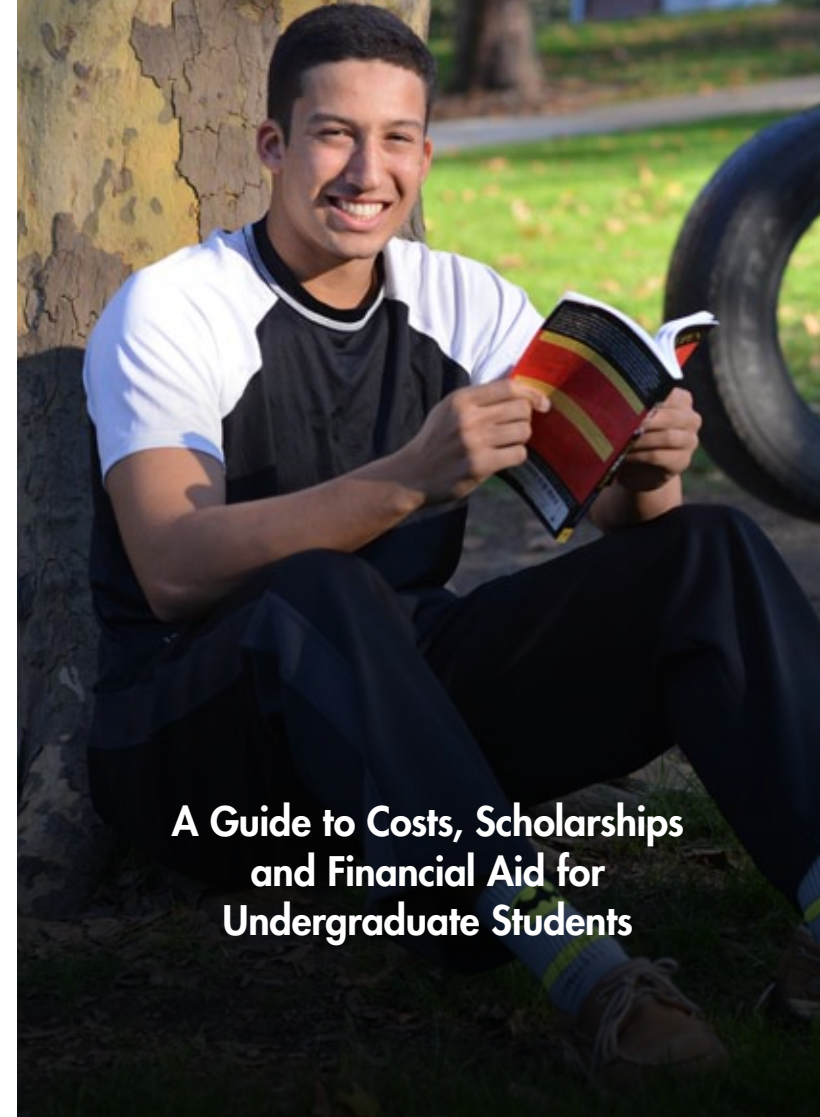

Our Commitment

Our Process

Maximize your financial aid award by following these steps:

1. Apply for admission to Geneva College

2. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to apply for federal and state aid

- File between October 1 and March 15 for priority consideration
- Student and a parent should get a FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov
- File online at fafsa.gov
- Geneva's college code is **003267**
- Please use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer tax data

3. Search for private scholarships

Our Timeline

September–October

- Apply for admission and search for private scholarships.
- Obtain student and parent FSA ID for filing the FAFSA.
- Gather your tax information from the previous year.
- File the FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov as early as October 1. List Geneva, using our school code **003267**. File by March 15 to receive priority awarding.
- Complete the PA state grant form, if applicable (link at the end of the FAFSA process).

November–March

- Receive and review your financial aid award email.
- Submit your enrollment deposit to secure your financial aid award, reserve your place at Geneva and receive clearance for course registration when it opens in May.

March–May

- Respond to your financial aid award email notification.
- Complete necessary documents and loan requirements to finalize your financial aid.
- May 1 is the deadline to file the FAFSA for Pennsylvania's State Grant (PHEAA).
- If you haven't already, send in your enrollment deposit.

May–August

- Fall semester bills are emailed to all students.
- Notify Geneva of private scholarships you expect to receive.
- Additional loan options can be considered. Applications take several weeks to finalize so please apply soon.
- Fall semester payment is due.

This information is valid for the **2017-18 academic year** only.

You are automatically considered for grants and scholarships from Geneva by being accepted for admission and filing the FAFSA form by our priority deadline of March 15.
