- Δ EDU 211 is a pre- or co-requisite for EDU 217 and a pre-requisite for EDU 375, 413, 414, 420
- Must have 3 sets of Pennsylvania clearances before enrolling in EDU 217 (Child Abuse, Background Check, and Fingerprints). Plan a semester in advance. Consult the Education Department for details.
- ± Must complete EDU 202, 217, and 211 prior to beginning the 300 and 400 level courses.
- ^ POL 352 requires prior successful completion of HUM 103, 203 and 303, and BIB 112 and 113.
- * The 6 Political Science electives must be distributed as follows: Students must take one upper level POL course in American Politics or Public Policy, one in Comparative or International Politics; and one in Political Theory. Students then take at least nine additional hours of upper level Political Science electives
- Additional Notes: POL 421 fulfills the Core requirement for a Capstone course, POL 352 counts for both the POL major and the Core; SSC 349 fulfills the requirement of MAT 105 and thus counts in both the POL and EDU majors; all Society courses required by the Core are fulfilled by courses required for the Social Studies Certification Requirements.
