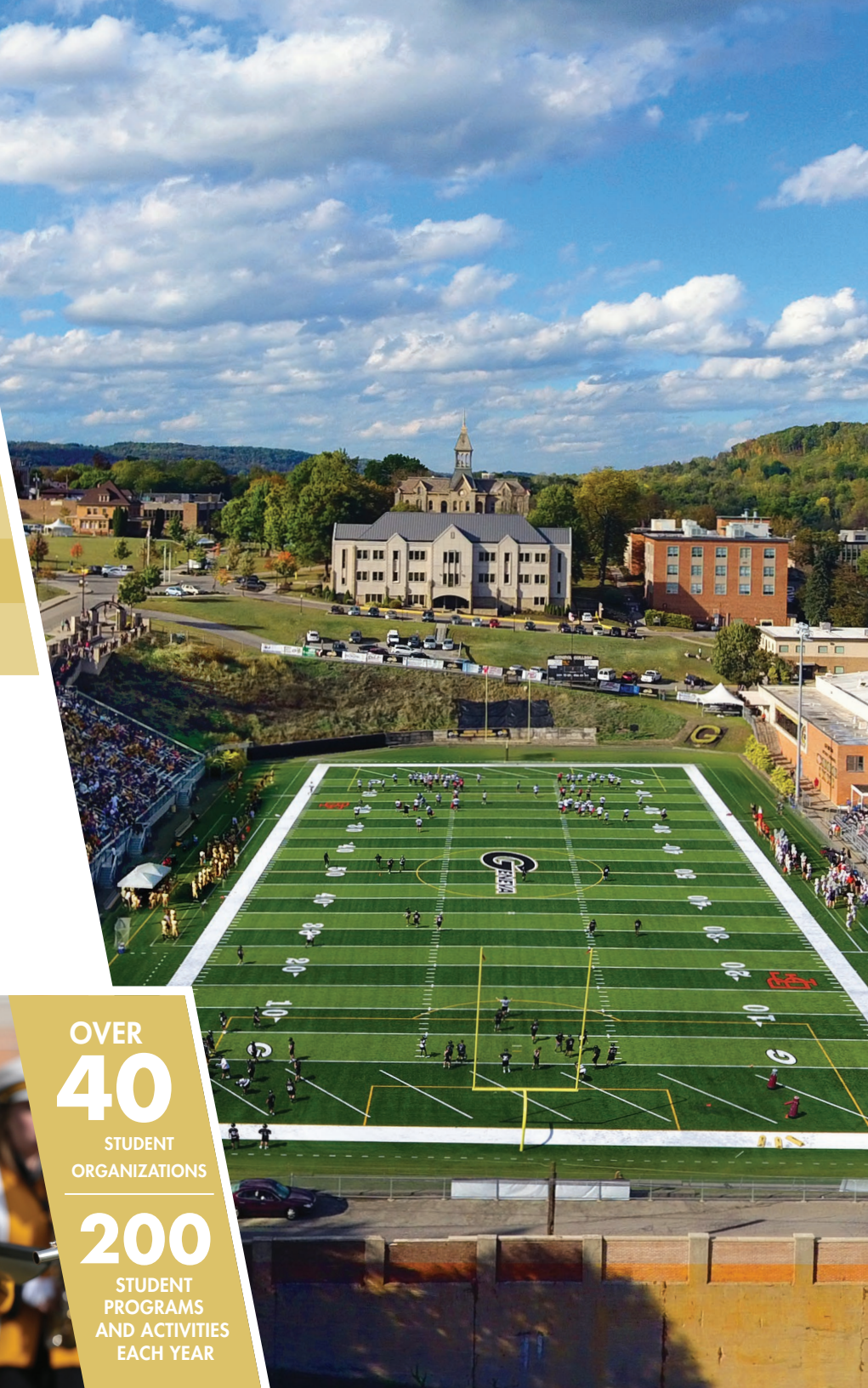
A Great Value

International students are eligible for some of the \$13.5 million Geneva College grants and scholarships awarded each year.

First Year Honors Program

Participate in honors-only sections of core classes, engage with fellow honors students and professors in enthusiastic discussions, develop service projects, and attend outstanding off-campus cultural events and retreats. Students are selected through an application and interview process during their senior year of high school. Geneva is pleased to arrange Skype interviews for global students who are unable to attend in person.

Each student selected for the program receives:

- A \$13,000 or \$16,000 a year scholarship for four years (determined upon acceptance)
- A \$2,000 Travel & Research Honorarium that may be used for off-campus study, academic research, or conference attendance after the first year is completed with a minimum GPA of 3.4

An additional five students receive a \$5,000 Honors Scholarship to be applied toward financial aid.

There are opportunities for honors students to continue beyond the first year through the Young Scholars Program and the Academic Partners Program.
