

SHOW SUMMARY

Setting: WBFR Radio Station

Time: October 1940's

A group of 1940's radio stars come together for a night of chills and thrills as they retell the stories of three famous Hitchcock films.

In *The Lodger*, Ellen and Robert Bunting are forced to rent a room in their Whitechapel home to a sinister lodger in order to bring their daughter Daisy home. Meanwhile, a mysterious murderer targets girls in London's Whitechapel district.

In *Sabotage*, Winnie, her husband Verloc, and her brother Stevie run a family cinema in London. A night of sabotage leads to an investigation into the family While the police suspect they are involved, Ted Spencer, the detective assigned to investigate, believes Winnie and Stevie are innocent.

In *The 39 Steps*, Richard Hannay is entrusted with important information by the mysterious Annabella Smith. During his search for a man Annabella mentions, he meets Pamela Stewart and must convince her to help him save government secrets from a group of foreign agents.




JACKSON WRIGHT — Jimmy McGhee


