Word

Read the following verses together!

- **John 13:1-17, Isaiah 52:7, Proverbs 4:26**
- During Biblical times, foot washing was a practice of hospitality that told the traveler, “rest your feet for a while, and then be on your way.” Jesus chose to wash His disciples’ feet as a symbol of service and sending. (vs. 16)
 - “Service” to show the counter cultural way of the King and “sending” to empower citizens of the Kingdom to carry good news and glad tidings into all the world.
- Why is it important that Jesus washes His disciples’ feet before sending them?
- Why does the Bible say that the feet that Jesus washes and sends are “beautiful”?

World

- What people does the world say that our feet should lead us to?
- How does this differ and how is this similar to the places and people the Lord says our feet should lead us to?

Us

- What are your feet guided by?

- Has God ever led your feet to places you would not have expected to be? What has that done to you? Share examples.
- Who are the people and where are the places that you hope and dream the Lord would take you to for the sake of His kingdom?
