An edited book:

Benson, Stephen, editor. Contemporary Fiction and the Fairy Tale. Wayne State UP, 2008.

An article or chapter in an edited book:

Anglo, Sydney. "Humanism and the Court Arts." *Impact of Humanism on Western Europe*, edited by Anthony Goodman, Longman, 1990, pp. 43-52.

An article in a print periodical:

Smith, Peter. "What Makes a Good Curriculum?" *Early Childhood Today*, vol. 12, no. 4, April 1965, pp. 348-352.
